The University of Arkansas at Little Rock (MidSoUTH) seeks applications for the position of Trainer (Foster Parent Program) Monticello (P97950). This position is responsible for delivery of the Foster Pride/Adopt Pride pre-service training curriculum and completion of the SAFE Home Study for prospective Foster/Adoptive families that complete this training. This position has regular contact with university personnel, DCFS and other public agencies, community professionals, and the general public. The Trainer is directly responsible to the Foster Parent Program Manager. This position requires extensive in-state travel and work outside normal office hours. This position is governed by state and federal laws, and agency/institution policy.

Required Qualifications: Master of Social Work or related Master's degree and three (3) years of professional experience with children and families.

Preferred Qualifications: Experience in writing home assessments, psycho-social histories, training in curriculum development and training delivery, trainer/instructor preferred. Appropriate professional licensure preferred, e.g., LMSW, LCSW, LAC, LPC.
